Past District Governor Lorraine Strickland was a passionate, dedicated, and highly respected member of Lions for decades. Beginning her Lionistic journey in **1977** with the **Lynwood Districts Lions Ladies Auxiliary**, Lorraine went on to join the **Lions Club of Canning City in 1992**, where she became a driving force for leadership, learning, and service.

Club Leadership

Lorraine served tirelessly within her club, contributing experience, enthusiasm, and unwavering commitment. Her roles included:

- **Club President – 3 terms**
- **Club Secretary – 3 terms**
- **Club Board Member – 16 years**

Her steady leadership and genuine passion for service supported the club's growth and helped shape its strong community presence.

District Contributions

Lorraine's influence extended widely across District 201W1, where she served in many significant roles, including:

- **Zone Chairman**
- **District Leadership & Development Chairman**
- **Membership & Extension Committee Member**
- **Youth of the Year District Chairman**
- **Zone Chairman Coordinator – 10 years**
- **Sergeant-at-Arms – District Conventions (two years)**

In **2001/2002**, Lorraine made history as:

- **The first female District Governor of 201W1**

Her dedication also extended into major Lions service initiatives, including:

- **Board Member & Honorary Secretary – Lions Save-Sight Foundation**
- **Chairman – Lions Save-Sight Foundation (from 2005 until her passing)**

Her leadership helped guide vital eye health projects and ensured strong governance across the Foundation.

At the Multiple District level, she also served as:

- **Member – MD Membership & Extension Committee (3 years)**
- **State Coordinator – Lions Youth of the Year (4 years)**
 - During her tenure, **three National Winners** came from Western Australia — an extraordinary achievement.

Lorraine's outstanding work in Lionism earned her numerous awards, including:

- **Progressive Melvin Jones Fellowship**
- **Multiple District, State, and Club-level recognitions celebrating her leadership and service**

Her awards reflect her passion for Lionism, her devotion to helping others, and her ability to inspire and mentor fellow Lions.

Beyond Lions

Lorraine was—and remains—highly respected as an **educator**. Her teaching career was interrupted by a **serious car accident in 1986**, but Lorraine's determination never faltered. During her recovery, she:

- **Enrolled in a Master's Program at Murdoch University**
- **Completed her Master's Degree**
- **Later became a lecturer at Murdoch University**, teaching and mentoring external education students

Her resilience, intellect, and passion for learning made her a powerful role model for students and colleagues alike.

Lorraine was widely admired for her ability to share her knowledge generously. Whether in the classroom, at club meetings, or at District events, she willingly guided anyone who sought her counsel.
